DIVISIONS AND CORE FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMISSION:

Adjudication Division

- Ensures the timely processing and resolution of disputed workers' compensation claims and medical fees;
- Provides an alternative method of resolving workers' compensation disputes through mediation;
- Provides judicial review of unemployment insurance appeals from the Idaho Department of Labor;
- Hears appeals from determinations made by the Crime Victims Compensation Program.

COMPENSATION DIVISION

- Evaluates insurance carriers requesting to write workers' compensation insurance and employers requesting to become self-insured;
- Ensures adequate securities are on deposit with the State Treasurer's Office to cover outstanding awards;
- Enforces the insurance requirements of the Idaho Workers' Compensation law (Title 72, Chapters 1-8, Idaho Code);
- Ensures that workers' compensation benefits are paid properly and timely.

REHABILITATION DIVISION

- Assists injured workers to maximize their medical recovery while facilitating an early return to employment, which is as close as possible to the worker's pre-injury wage and status.

CRIME VICTIMS COMPENSATION PROGRAM

- Provides financial assistance to victims of crime for health care and related expenses incurred as a result of criminally injurious contact.


ADJUDICATION:

- **Workers' compensation hearings held in FY14** were nearly identical to FY13, down 18% from the prior 5-year average, and down 24% from the prior 10-year average.
- **Mediations** decreased approximately 4% from FY13.
- **Full resolution** resulted in more than 94% of mediations.
- **Approved lump sum settlements** increased approximately 82% from FY13, and increased approximately 22% from the prior 5-year average.
- **Number of Appeals to the Idaho Supreme Court** were identical to FY13, and approximately 13% higher than the prior 10-year average.
- **Medical fee disputes** decreased by 25% from 222 to 167 in FY14.

With the **unemployment rate** in Idaho dropping to **4.7%** in **June 2014** (source: Idaho Department of Labor), the unemployment insurance appeals that the Adjudication Division receives has continued in a downward trend from a high of **1,129** in **FY10**.

The number of appeals is now reasonably comparable to the 5-year average prior to the economic decline. In **FY14**, the Adjudication Division complied with the federal average case age timeliness standard of **40 days**, by posting an **average case age** of **25 days** during the federal measuring period.

BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION:

- **Phone inquiries:** Benefit analysts responded to almost 8,000 phone inquiries – as a direct result 386 complaints and 241 First Reports of Injury were provided to injured workers.
- **Lump sum settlements:** Analysts reviewed and made recommendations to the Commissioners on 1,115 proposed lump sum settlements – average time from receipt to approval decreased by 63%.
- **Education:** Analysts also conduct outreach training to employers and medical providers.
- **Requests for records:** Records personnel received and processed more than 2,200 requests for records searches covering more than 6,000 individual claims, providing vital claim records to attorneys involved in workers' compensation claims.

1,511 employers obtained insurance as a result of being contacted by an Employer Compliance investigator, resulting in coverage for **13,286 Idaho workers.**





The initial interview conducted with the worker establishes a solid relationship of continued work between the injured worker and Rehabilitation Consultant.


Employment Status of Rehabilitated Cases




CRIME VICTIMS COMPENSATION:

- Victims assisted: 37,144
- Victims assisted currently: 7,577
- Crime-related/treatment services paid: approx. \$45.02 million
- FY14 increase in restitution/subrogation collections: 17%
- Collections: currently approx. 35% of ordered restitution (one of the highest rates in the country)
- Criminal conduct against women/children: approx. 89% of cases served
- Children: 67% of crime victims
- Child forensic exams: averaged 88% of total forensic exam cases (received over the past 5 years)
- Child forensic exams high, FY14: 94% of forensic exam cases received


CVCP Funding Sources




Forensic Exams
